Most Satisfied Students

Results showed 86.1% were satisfied with their educational experience at ECU. We were also the top Western Australia public university for teaching quality, support, resources and skills development.



What's happening in Perth?

One of the most exciting projects happening in Perth is the development of **Elizabeth Quay**, a waterfront destination in the Perth Central Business District, offering a range of activities to attract people of all ages, at all times of the year.

One and a half hectares of promenade space link a series of public parks and spaces around the new inlet to the island - a more relaxed space with views back to the city. The promenade and public domain are free and people-friendly and will be complemented by new shops, restaurants and entertainment.

While not finalised, new data shows more than 6.6 million people have visited the quay since opening in January 2016 and several successful businesses have emerged, offering new experiences for locals and visitors.

Over the last few years, there have been many urban developments in and around Perth, with some still to come very soon:

- The new **Perth Stadium**, on track for completion in time for the start of the 2018 AFL season, will be a multi-purpose venue capable of hosting AFL, rugby, football (soccer), cricket and entertainment events that will have an initial 60,000 seat capacity.
- The **New Museum for Western Australia**, set to be completed by 2020, is one of the most significant museum redevelopments in the world today.
- The new **Perth Children's Hospital** will open in the near future, just a few years after the Fiona Stanley Hospital opened, in 2015.

Access & Support for Everyone

We celebrate diversity at ECU and strive to create an environment that enables students to achieve their goals regardless of age, family responsibility or family status, impairment, gender, marital status, political convictions, pregnancy, race, religion or sexual orientation.

Equity, Diversity & Disability

ECU's Equity, Diversity and Disability (EDD) services support students whose studies may be affected by a medical condition or disability, either their own or that of a family member. EDD staff can assist with arranging alternative assessment conditions, access to some aids and equipment, note taking, AUSLAN interpreting and transcription services. Every campus has a specially designed Accessible Technologies Room that provides students with access to adjustable chairs and desks, specialised software, computer, scanner and other adaptive technology. All ECU locations have access for people with disabilities.

Respect for Diversity

Volunteering at ECU

ECU students are invited to sign up and take part in the exciting Volunteering at ECU Program. Volunteering as a student is a great way to get involved in the local community, meet people from diverse walks of life and make new friends.

Additionally, volunteering is a great way to grow and develop your professional skills, improving your chances in the labour market when you start applying for paid jobs.

Peer Mentoring at ECU

A successful peer mentoring program runs across most schools at ECU. The program links new students in their first year with a mentor (a current student) in the same course or study area.

Peer mentors provide students with support and guidance, and can help answer questions or concerns about their transition to university life at ECU. Mentors know from their own personal experience what it's like to start out at ECU, so they can give others all the inside information needed to succeed.

Dependents of ECU Students

Schooling

If you intend to bring dependent children to Australia, you will need to consider specific arrangements for their visas and schooling. In Australia, it is compulsory for school aged children (6-16 years of age) to attend school.

You must enrol your dependent children in either government or private schools on a fee-paying basis. You are required to pay the school fees directly to the school prior to enrolment.

However, if you are a Masters or PhD student, then you are able to enrol your dependent children into public primary and secondary schools at no cost.

English as a Second Language

If your dependent children are enrolled in a public or private school and require either English as a Second Language or learning difficulty/disability support, you will need to pay for these additional expenses.

These costs will vary and may involve your dependent children moving to a school specifically designed to provide the required support. We recommend that your dependent children commence English language training prior to arriving in Perth.

Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS)

The Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000 provides important safeguards for overseas students in Australia. The ESOS Act regulates the activities of education providers, like ECU, who deliver education and training to international students by setting standards and providing for tuition and financial assurance. ECU's teaching and support of international students are guided and monitored by the Department of Education under the ESOS Framework.

The Conciliator attempts to resolve disputes between international students and institutions, as part of the institution's internal complaints and appeals procedure.

Fees

As a new student, you will need to consider how much your university studies will cost and what forms of assistance are available to you.

Tuition fees are the main expense you will incur while you study; however, there are other costs as well, some of which are listed below.

Tuition Fees

The tuition fees you pay are based on the course and units you elect to study. Once you commence a course with ECU, as long as you remain in your course with academic and financial good standing, you will be protected against any significant jump in fees. Your fees will only increase by a marginal amount each year. Refer to the Course Listings and Fees at the end of this brochure or visit international.ecu.edu.au/fees to use our online Fees Calculator for more information.

Other Expenses

You will be responsible for purchasing textbooks and any equipment required for your course. The cost of these items varies widely depending on the course. Other expenses you are likely to incur include food, parking, consumables such as stationery and photocopying, as well as transport costs to and from university, including any work placements or off-campus activities.

Living Costs

Whether you live on-campus or off-campus, you should budget about \$380 per week for your living costs. Please note that this does not include tuition fees, textbooks, running a car or holiday travel.

If you bring your spouse/children with you to Australia, you will need to allocate a significantly larger sum of money per week and you should consider additional expenses such as school fees and childcare costs (if applicable).

Upfront Payment Flexibility

Students and their sponsors can now choose to pay more than 50 per cent of tuition fees up-front if they wish to do so.

This allows students and those paying fees on their behalf, such as their parents or a scholarship sponsor, to pay any amount greater than 50 per cent of the tuition fees to take advantage of favourable exchange rates or have the convenience of only paying once.

ECU's International Student Tuition Fee Refund Policy

ECU's International Student Tuition Fee Refund Policy applies to international students who cease or do not begin studying at ECU. The purpose of the policy is to clarify your entitlement to refund of fees and relevant processes, as required under government regulation.

Overseas Student Health Cover

If you are applying for a Student Visa, you are required to arrange Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) before your arrival in Australia, and maintain cover for the full length of your visa.

OSHC is a basic health insurance product designed to be equivalent to Medicare (for Australian citizens). It covers emergency medical conditions, public hospitals and most of the costs of visiting a doctor. Please note that pre-existing illnesses may not be covered. Additional cover for private hospitals and supplementary services such as dental, optical and physiotherapy is available at additional cost. ECU can assist you in arranging cover on your behalf.

Scholarships

Going to university can be a very rewarding experience, but also a costly one. One way to assist you with your expenses is to apply for a scholarship. Scholarships are not loans, they provide funds that can be used to cover fees, cost of books, travel and a wide range of other expenses, and they are not required to be repaid.

ECU Funded Scholarships

At ECU, we have a number of scholarships that can help ease your financial pressure and help make your studies more affordable.

To be eligible for any of these scholarships, you must first apply for the scholarship before you apply for your course at ECU.

Merit International Scholarship

The Merit International Scholarship is offered to international students who have demonstrated high levels of academic achievement and English competency in their previous studies. The scholarship offers a 10% reduction in your tuition fees for the duration of your course at ECU.

Family and Alumni International Scholarship

The Family and Alumni International Scholarship recognises the commitment and loyalty of international students who are ECU alumni, or have immediate family members who are ECU students or alumni. The scholarship offers a 10% reduction in tuition fees for the duration of your course at ECU.

South West Campus International Scholarship

South West Campus International Scholarship is offered to eligible international students who apply to study at ECU's South West Campus in Bunbury, Western Australia. The scholarship acknowledges the value ECU places on international perspectives. The scholarship provides a 10% reduction in your tuition fees for the duration of your course at ECU.

Australian Awards Scholarships

Australian Awards Scholarships are long-term development awards administered by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. They aim to contribute to the long-term development needs of Australia's partner countries in line with bilateral and regional agreements. High Quality Research

They are recognised as being 'well above world standard' and have consistently received the maximum rating (5) for quality through the Excellence in Research for Australia (ERA) framework. Our Field-Weighted Citation Impact, which takes into account the differences in research behaviour across disciplines, is 2.1 for nursing and 1.04 for Midwifery.

This means we are cited twice the world average for nursing and 4% more than the world average for midwifery. Our research in the fields of chronic disease management, child and family health, safety and quality of healthcare are recognised as innovative and relevant to national and international audiences. 
Growing up, I always wanted to be a teacher. My passion for working with children was further developed through coaching soccer. I decided to study teaching at ECU based on its excellent reputation.

English Minimum Requirements

Academic IELTS: 6.0 (no individual band less than 6.0)

TOEFL iBT: 70 (no individual score less than 17)

GCE O Level: Grade C or better from specific countries as detailed in ECU's English Policy

GCE A Level: Grade E or better from specific countries as detailed in ECU's English Policy

Pearson Test of English (PTE): 57 with no score less than 50 for IELTS 6.0 courses. 64, with no score less than 58 for IELTS 6.5 courses. For a more complete and up to date list, please see our website.

OET: A minimum score of B in each of the four components (listening, reading, speaking and writing).





Edith Cowan College

Edith Cowan College (ECC) is ECU's on-campus academic and English pathway provider. ECC is a member of Navitas and is located on ECU's Joondalup and Mount Lawley campuses. In association with ECU, ECC offers University Pathway Programs for students needing academic or English preparation before entering ECU.

Undergraduate

Academic undergraduate pathway to ECU

ECC's Diploma programs are recognised by ECU for advanced standing, providing you with a convenient alternative entry pathway into Year 1 or Year 2 of select ECU Bachelor degrees, with no further entry test.

ECC offers a broad range of diploma programs in the following areas: Business; Communications and Creative Industries; Hotel Management; Science (Computing / Information Technology); Science (Health Studies) including Nursing, and Science (Engineering Studies). These programs are taught on ECU's Joondalup Campus.

Postgraduate Qualifying Program (PQP)

The ECC Postgraduate Qualifying Program (PQP) is a non-award program designed to lead students into the following ECU Master degrees with one unit of advanced standing:

- Master of Professional Accounting*
- Master of Business Administration
- Master of Business Administration International
- Master of Finance and Banking
- Master of Human Resource Management
- Master of Marketing and Innovation Management
- Master of Project Management
- Master of International Hospitality Management

*Advanced standing is not available for this course.

The program is designed for students who already have tertiary qualifications but have not qualified for direct entry into university Master programs.

The program will equip students with the knowledge, skills and English Language Proficiency (ELP) for entry into Masters degrees in the School of Business and Law at ECU.

English requirements

The minimum English requirement is IELTS 6.0 with no band below 6.0. Students who don't meet this requirement must be packaged with academic English and demonstrate English competency before enrolling in the PQP.

Academic requirements

The academic entry requirements are completion of an approved three-year qualification post Senior High School Certificate (or equivalent).

English pathway to ECU

ECC offers English language programs for people from non-English speaking backgrounds and direct entry pathways for international students wishing to undertake university study at ECU.

ECC is renowned for its excellent teaching staff, high-quality programs and outstanding facilities.

Academic English programs offered at ECC

ECC offers the Academic English Program (AEP), which is designed for students who plan to study at university or who are interested in developing academic reading, writing, listening and communications skills.

Students have the opportunity to develop their language skills and enhance their studies in higher education. The program focuses on a combination of communication skills and academic study skills.


Students who do not have the required English score for direct entry into their academic program can have AEP packaged with their academic program.

The AEP, taught on the ECU Mount Lawley Campus, is offered in 10 week blocks (at all levels) with 9 fixed start dates per year (every 5 weeks). Following completion of the required level, students will not be required to take an English test for entry into ECU (excluding programs where IELTS is compulsory, such as Nursing). In order to progress, students must achieve a minimum of 65% at the required level.

Students will be placed in the correct level according to their IELTS result below, and be required to pass that level in order to move to the next level or commence their academic program.


Undergraduate English package guide

Application Process

Getting ready for your academic journey at ECU is simple. Here's how to submit your application to us if you are applying for undergraduate courses or postgraduate coursework courses.

If you need assistance, our Education Agents can help you with finding the right course, gathering your documents and/or applying to ECU. Visit international.ecu.edu.au/agents to find an agent near you.

1. Choose your course at ECU

At ECU, we have hundreds of courses from which to choose, so you're likely to find one that will match your career aspirations.

2. Check your eligibility

Once you choose your course, you need to make sure that you meet ECU's minimum academic and English requirements, as well as any course specific requirements.

3. Apply for a scholarship

We offer a few coursework scholarships that could help make your studies more affordable. These scholarships require you to apply for the scholarship before you apply for your course at ECU.

4. Gather your documents

It is important to submit a complete application, so make sure you include all of the relevant documents.

Use the following checklist to make sure you don't miss anything:

- ▶ Copy of passport photo page

We may ask for additional information, depending on your circumstances and the course for which you are applying.

5. Submit your application

If your application satisfies all of our criteria, we will send you an offer to start studying at ECU – congratulations!

We may send you a full offer or a conditional offer (the latter indicates that you'll have to meet the specific conditions detailed on your offer).

7. Accept your offer

Your offer letter will contain specific instructions as to how to accept your offer via our online system.

As part of the acceptance process, you will need to pay your fees via electronic payment transfer (please note that it may take a week for us to receive your money).



8. Receive your CoE

Once we have received your payment, we will issue you with a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), which is the document you will need to apply for your student visa.

Depending on your country of citizenship, you may be required to provide evidence of your financial capacity before your CoE is issued.

If you do not receive your CoE in time to commence in your chosen semester, we may offer you the opportunity to start your course in a subsequent semester to give you time for visa processing.

9. Apply for your visa

Once you have received your CoE, you'll be able to apply for your student visa. ECU does not provide visa assistance services, so if you need visa support, consider using one of ECU's education agents.

Research Application Process

Getting ready to apply for a research degree can seem quite daunting so we've laid out the following process to assist you.

We recommend that you complete your application four to six weeks prior to any deadline. An incomplete application will result in delays, which means you could potentially miss deadlines, so make sure that your application is complete before submitting it.

1. Check your dates

At ECU, our research courses have specific start dates, except for our PhD, which you can start at any time during the year.

We also have application deadlines, so it is imperative that you allow ample time for the process of your application.

Our research scholarships have opening and closing dates. Visit ecu.edu.au/scholarships to get more details.

2. Know your topic

You'll need to prepare a 300-word abstract as well as two-page proposal on your topic. Your initial abstract and proposal will tell us about you, including how much you know about ECU, research in your area of study, how passionate you are about your subject, and how familiar you are with the prospective supervisors within the ECU schools.

3. Prepare your documents

- Copies of your Honours or Masters Thesis, as well as any publications you have produced (if applicable)

4. Apply directly to ECU or through an agent

5. Receive our initial assessment

We will take an initial look at your application (qualifications / topic / abstract / proposal) to ensure it is closely aligned with our areas of research focus, and that we have supervisors in your research area. This assessment can take four to six weeks, depending on academic availability. Please note that December and January is our busiest time so, during this period, our initial assessment will take longer.

We will communicate with you via email, so it is important for you to check your email regularly to ensure there are no delays with your application.

6. Progress your application

If your application satisfies all our criteria, it will be progressed for further assessment. It is during this time that we will verify your qualifications and assign a research supervisor to you. Processing time for the assessment of your application will vary based on academic availability.

7. Receive the final outcome of your application

If we have supervisory capacity and if your application is competitive, we will send you an offer to commence your studies at ECU. If not, we will inform you of the outcome via email.

8. Accept your offer

Your offer letter will contain specific instructions as to how to accept your offer via our online system.

As part of the acceptance process, you will need to pay your fees via electronic payment transfer (please note that it may take a week for us to receive your money).

9. Receive your CoE

Once we have received your payment, we will issue you with a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), which is the document you will need to apply for your student visa.

If you do not receive your CoE in time to commence in your chosen semester, we may offer you the opportunity to start your course in a subsequent semester, to give you time for visa processing.


